Background: Klamath County Public Health is seeking board approval to apply for the Barclay-Giel Seed Grant on behalf of the Klamath Basin Oral Health Coalition. The grant program supports innovative projects that align with the Surgeon General’s priorities, one of which is oral health. The Klamath Basin Oral Health Coalition, which KCPH helps to coordinate, is focused on awareness, access, and advocacy over the next three years.

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# Barclay-Giel Seed Grants

## Overview of the Barclay-Giel Seed Grants

The PHS Commissioned Officers Foundation (COF) for the Advancement of Public Health seeks to support community-based public health programs.

The program is named after the late Martha Barclay-Giel, a retired Captain of the Commissioned Corps of the U.S. Public Health Service. Captain Barclay-Giel dedicated her life's worth to advancing the health of Americans. After retiring, she donated considerable sums of money to COF and is a member of the [John Adams Society \(/john-adams-society.html\)](#).

## Grant Amounts

The maximum grant amount is \$10,000. The typical grant amount will be about \$5,000. COF may elect to provide less than the full amount requested. All the grant-awarded funds must be used by June 30, 2020, and there is no opportunity for additional or continuation grant funds for the same grant.

## Submission Timeline

The 2019 funding cycle is now open. We will use an online submission process. The deadline will be **February 22**. Grant awards are expected to be announced in June 2019.

## Eligible Applicants

Any non-profit entity, including 501(c)(3) or local/state/tribal organization, whose primary mission is addressing one or more public health issues. This includes local/state/tribal health departments.

## Eligible Public Health Issues

The grants are open to all areas of public health. However, areas of prime interest for this grant cycle are the Surgeon General's Priorities (<https://www.surgeongeneral.gov/priorities/index.html>). These include Opioids and Addiction, Tobacco, Community Health and Economic Prosperity, Health and National Security, Oral Health, and Emerging Public Health Threats. Some funds will be set aside for these areas of prime interest. Funds may be used for any type of public health project and may include such things as community initiatives, strategic public health plans, or "proof of concept" intervention projects. We encourage applicants to consider how projects may support Healthy People 2020 Topics and Objectives (<https://www.healthypeople.gov/2020/topics-objectives>).

## Rating Criteria

All applications will be evaluated and ranked competitively based on the following criteria:

- A clear and concise description of the intended use of the funds
- Defined public health goal and measurable outcomes
- The likelihood of a successful outcome
- Innovation
- Ability to leverage grant funds to obtain more funds to address the same public health issue
- Ability to describe the "next step" to be taken by the applicant organization after the COF grant funds are used to address the public health issue
- Partnerships with other organizations (not required to apply)

2. Provide a brief overview statement about the applicant organization and its mission to advance public health. (Limited to 300 characters.)
3. Provide the organization's 2018 annual budget total.
4. Provide the organization's current total number of paid full-time employees.
5. Include the Federal tax status of the organization.
6. What is the amount requested?
7. Describe the specific public health issue(s) the grant funds will address and the desired public health goal. (Limited to 600 characters.)
8. Describe how the grant will be used to address the health issue described above (also known as the project) and what outcome constitutes a successful project. (Limited to 600 characters.)
9. Does your project support one of the Surgeon General's priorities? If so, which one, and, how does it support this priority? (Limited to 600 characters.)
10. Describe an innovative or unique aspect of the proposed project. What makes this project different from projects with similar goals? (Limited to 600 characters.)
11. Describe all partner organizations in the project and briefly describe each of their roles. (Not required to answer if none exist.) (Limited to 600 characters.)
12. Provide a brief timeline for the project, including the dates and location of events, which must include the expected date of completion. (Limited to 600 characters.)
13. Describe how you plan to track the project to measure its success. (Limited to 600 characters.)
14. Upload a [budget \(/uploads/1/0/5/1/105160231/seedgrants\\_budget-2019.xlsx\)](/uploads/1/0/5/1/105160231/seedgrants_budget-2019.xlsx) showing the sources of all project funds (including the requested Seed Grant) and what the funds will be used for: personnel, materials, food, travel, etc. Please complete and upload the form provided above. 15. Describe the planned "next steps" after the project is completed to address the public health issue stated above. (Limited to 600 characters.)
16. Provide a letter of support from another organization for the project. (Not required.) (pdf, doc, docx files accepted)
