Things to know regarding the May 21, 2019 – Special District Election

- 1) **Everyone** registered in Klamath County, Oregon will get to vote on **Measure 18-113: 9-1-1 Five Year Renewal**.
- 2) **Only** those registered with a residence address in the **Merrill Rural Fire Protection District** will receive **Measure 18-114: Merrill RFPD 5 Year Local Option Tax**.

- 3) **The last day to register as a new voter is April 30**. Postmarks **DO count**. You can register on-line at: oregonvotes.gov or come to the County Clerk's office, 305 Main St. If you go to DMV, it takes 21 days for your voter registration to be complete, so if in doubt, please check with our office or check your voter registration on-line at: oregonvotes.gov. You can update your registration anytime.
- 4) Not all races will be on all ballots. Each ballot is designed specifically for where you reside and the districts your residence address includes.
- 5) **The order of the names on the ballot** is determined by a random drawing done by the Secretary of State.
- 5) **Ballots will be mailed May 1**. Remember that **postmarks DO NOT count** on ballots, and that voted ballots must be received in the Elections Office or in any official drop site by 8pm on Election Day.
